LESSON PLAN

Garden Marketplace

Objective

Recognize the various ways in which people earn and use money for goods and services.

Organize written content to clearly convey and communicate information to a specific audience.

Engage & Explore

Introduce the lesson by reading *Tops and Bottoms*. Discuss what Hare decided to do with all the vegetables he grew.

Activity

1. Students should pick a single crop to grow and produce a product from the garden. Students will sell the product to earn money for the garden for future sustainability.

 - Why is being an expert on a topic important?
